Do you know what's going on backstage at tonight's Drake concert?

Pull back the curtain and you will find that a company, called Rhino Staging, that staffs concerts at the Tacoma Dome and some other venues, doesn't pay a living wage to riggers and backstage workers who staff the concerts. Rhino also fails to offer health care or other benefits. Safety is a constant concern.

Rhino workers in Washington and Oregon have voted to form a union, but the company's owners have resisted for months and months to sit down and bargain in good faith and reach an agreement as required by labor laws.

What makes this even worse, many concert venues – such as the Sunlight Supply Amphitheater, the Tacoma Dome and Safeco Field – are publicly owned. Should a company that refuses to bargain in good faith, that doesn't pay a living wage, or offer benefits, where safety is a real issue, be allowed to operate on public property?
